Not a week goes by without a phone call from a parent from yesteryear asking if they can speak to Mrs. Roberts to report their child's success in the adult world and to thank her for her counsel, for the positive impact she had upon their child/ren and to say, "Yes you were right!"

I have also welcomed several ex-Froebel students back into the fold who have popped in to see if she is here and to walk around the school; I watch the students as they pop into their old classrooms and enjoy the fact that, in each case, they cite Froebel as a having had a major influence upon their success, due to the grounding and preparation they received and the impact Mrs. Roberts had upon them.

I thought the best way to describe the weekend was to leave it to the Robinwood staff who took the time to pen me a letter. Enjoy.





I am writing this letter to compliment you on the standard of behaviour of the children you brought to our Dobroyd Castle centre last weekend. As the Senior Course Leader assigned to the school I have had the opportunity to work with your activity groups all throughout the trip; from their first arrival, during mealtimes and activities all the way through to your departure on Sunday. Whenever I have spent time with your groups I found them to be excited, enthusiastic and keen to enjoy the activities!

In supporting the instructors I also get feedback from them; not just the group leaders but the supporting staff as well. For example, Julia was assigned the evening meals for your school and commented on their manners at the dinner table and when receiving their food, as well as keeping a reasonable level of noise when in the dining room. She said she'd happily look after them again!

I have also gathered feedback from the group leaders themselves, as we always meet at the end of a course to discuss how it went:

Alec was the Course Leader for the school, and commented on the children's ability to listen at key times when he would have to explain what to expect during the trip. With his own activity group he was most impressed with their resilience and determination on the high activities; on the walk in from the coach park he had been chatting with his group and already identified a number of children who were nervous, but by the 3<sup>rd</sup> day every child had attempted and was even thriving when challenged by the high activities!


